School Council

This week, the children in School Council are busy organising our fundraising for two charities – Christian Aid and Toilet Twinning. Today, they are launching their fundraising project and on Thursday they are asking that children (and parents) bring in loose change to try to cover the words 'Flush Away Poverty' on the playground. This is the motto for the charity Toilet Twinning, which raises money to help the 2.4 billion people in the world who do not have a toilet.

£60 will help those in desperate poverty to have access to a proper toilet, clean water and the information they need to be healthy. We are hoping, over the rest of this year, to raise enough money to twin each of our toilets in school with one across the world and our School Council will choose the countries to be linked with. We are also part of a pilot project with Christian Aid (one of only two York schools to be chosen to work towards an award which is being developed), so will also put some of the money raised towards helping this charity, who are particularly focussing on making safe homes for people.
