Y4/5 Project Launch Day

Next year, our Y5/6 class will be taking part in a project entitled 'Railway to Greenway', involving 100 children from Riccall Primary, Archbishop of York Junior and Naburn. A variety of external agencies are also involved, including Sustrans and York Greenway. This is a very exciting project exploring the old railway line, how it has changed over the years and how it has influenced our local community. On Friday, the children will be attending a Launch Day in the Village Hall, to find out more about the project. This will involve meeting the other schools and the adults involved and taking part in activities to begin to explore the old railway line. They will be sowing seeds, planting seedlings, looking at the bird hides, learning about the solar system and also taking part in sports activities on the field. They will need to wear school uniform, bring a school jumper (even if it is warm) to protect arms from any nettles, bring a sun hat/waterproof depending on the weather, and bring a packed lunch to be eaten at the village hall.
