

Oak Homework Topic Tasks

Over the autumn term you have 12 topic based homework tasks to complete. You may choose 6 of them to do in any order and display them as creatively as you like.

I will be collecting any tasks completed at the end of the term, providing an opportunity for you to show off what you have created.

As well as these tasks, spellings will be handed out weekly, to learn in preparation for our spelling test on a Friday morning. I also ask that you practise your times tables weekly in preparation for our times tables test on a Friday.

Imagine you are in charge of the country and write a set of laws. Include what the punishments would be for breaking your laws!	Investigate who invented electricity and create a fact file about them. Present this any way you desire.	Based on your learning on crime and punishment – make a model of your favourite punishment, explaining what sort of crime you would have to commit to receive your punishment.	Pretend you are an Electricity Safety Inspector. Make a checklist of possible dangers in the home (e.g too many plugs in one socket is a fire risk). Add diagrams to show these.
Make a wanted poster for a famous real or fictional criminal e.g Jack the Ripper, Mary Ann Cotton, Voldemort, Moriarty... Don't forget to include their crimes and a reward.	Make an electrical timeline – find out how something has changed since it has been invented.	Listen to the news or read a newspaper for a week – Make notes on the crimes reported and how the criminal was punished.	Research and create a set of top trumps cards about different crimes. You will need to include the crime, length of punishment, severity of punishment and pictures.
Write an acrostic poem for Crime or Punishment.	Make a cartoon strip about electrical safety.	Design a poster promoting the benefits of electricity in our society.	Find out how a solar panel works – display your findings in an interesting way.
