Year 6 Secondary School Places

Next week CYC will begin to notify parents/carers how to find out which school your child has been allocated and how you can find out key information usually contained within the allocation letter. They will be directing parents/carers to web page https://www.york.gov.uk/SecondarySchoolAdmissions which will contain all of the relevant information such as how to log into Parent Portal, request an appeal form and apply for home to school transport.

You will need to log into your Parent Portal account to find out which school your child has been allocated. We would advise all parents/carers to ensure that you know your Parent Portal username (email address) and password before 1st March as due to the high volume of parents/carers logging into Parent Portal nationally, any password reset requests may take longer than usual.

A poster should be arriving in school this week, with further details on, but we thought we would let you know in advance so that you have longer to make sure you have access to this portal. We will obviously pass the poster on to you when it arrives.
