We have been asked to share the following with you by the Family Learning team at City of York Council:

The Family Learning team are hosting an online drop in for parents and carers throughout March and April. We will be on Zoom between 7.30 and 8.30pm every Tuesday to talk about the things you want to talk about.

We'll share information from our parent survey about what's worked well during the pandemic, challenges and concerns, and we'll have weekly topics decided by you, such as managing stress, children's anxiety, food and mood, special needs safety online, phonics and early reading tips, Q&A sessions with experts ... you tell us what you want and we'll do our best to organise it.
