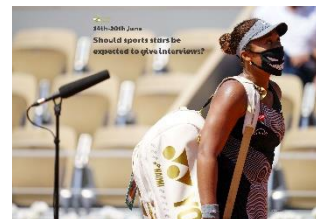

PE kit
