Great to see the delight and pride on the faces of our Stars of the Week holding their well-deserved certificates. Congratulations!




'Ave a Go!'

WHO IS EMMA RADACANU?

Emma Raducanu was born in Canada and moved to London when she was two, her mum is Chinese, and her dad is Romanian.

Emma was five years old when she first tried tennis and by seven was playing local and regional competitions in the south of England. At 12, she was playing in international tennis tournaments and by 14 had played for Team GB juniors.

In 2021 after taking some time out to focus on her A-levels Emma received a wild card to finally make her Grand Slam debut at Wimbledon. She made it to the fourth round, where she had to retire after suffering breathing difficulties. Emma then returned to tennis following her qualifying to take part in the US Open which she were not roughly which she went on to win!



FACTS

- She is the youngest ever Briton to win a Grand Slam title.
- · Emma is the first British female tennis player to win a Grand Slam in 44 years.
- · Two weeks ago, Emma had a flight home booked as she wasn't sure if she would get past the qualifying stages of the tournament.
- · Emma has just completed her A-Levels achieving an A and an A*.



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
