# Covid-19 Update

# Changes to isolation and testing

Another change this week was to the length of time staff and pupils with a positive lateral flow test result should self-isolate, in line with the stay at home guidance for households with possible or confirmed Covid infection.

It is now possible to end self-isolation after seven days, following two negative lateral flow tests taken 24 hours apart. The first lateral flow test should not be taken before the sixth day.

*From next Tuesday (11 January),* if staff or pupils do not have symptoms, but have a positive lateral flow test, they do not need to get a confirmatory PCR test.
