It would be a valuable exercise for you to ask them questions about it and it would be great to give them the ability to hopefully show off their own knowledge, which I am confident, they are developing.

I also believe that it is a good document for parents in other year groups to be aware of as it will give you a detailed idea of expectations in Numeracy as the children move through the school.


