We are beginning to think about raising funds for our Ukrainian family. This is a project that I believe our School Council might take on.

I think it is important for me to give you some background to their circumstances. Their financial situation is very lean. They have £600 to last 6 weeks for food, clothing and travel plus any other needs until some back-dated benefits come through from universal credit. Hopefully child benefit will then follow. The family in the village that they are living with have received some gifts and donations of clothes and bikes, and are well set up with toys and games. Ivan's mother is keen to be independent but language is a big barrier to any job for which she is qualified.

The summer holidays are looming large on the horizon and we all know that 6 weeks is a long time!! I have been informed that fundraising for a stay at the seaside or for occasional weekend outings would be most appreciated. I will be in touch with more information, details and ideas. In the meantime, please get back to me, if you have any thoughts. Thank you
