<u>Year 3/4</u> will be looking at historical fiction linked to our Tudor topic.

Together with instructions, poetry and non-chronological reports.

Year 3/4 Class Novel:

Year 5/6 will be learning historical adventure writing, suspense writing, instructions, biographies and poetry.

Maths

Year 3/4 will be focusing on fractions, decimals (incl money), mass, time and statistics.

Year 5/6 will focus on number/arithmetic and all aspects of reasoning; different methodologies for problem solving; clearly explaining our mathematical thinking both verbally and in writing.



We are very excited to start our new topic on 'The Tudors' this week. We will be learning all about the Kings and Queens of this time together with what life was like for people living in Tudor times. This is a huge cross-curricular topic and allows us to cover many subjects within it...

<u>History</u>- placing the Tudors in history, Henry VIII and his six wives, Shakespeare, Tudor clothes, foods, crime and punishments and lots more.

<u>Geography</u>- learning about how human and physical geography has changed since the Tudor era and what countries and oceans were discovered by famous explorers such as Sir Francis Drake.

<u>Art:</u> The Tudor Rose and Tudor Portraits.

Music: Learning Tudor songs and exploring Tudor music.
