This will also be the point at which I will be able to divulge the staffing structure for the new academic year. I am confident that it will be the one that will suit the school best and, in turn, reassure you about our desire to get the school back on course. 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Safeguarding

The National Online Safety's parent bulletin this week is about Twitch and we have added an 'e-safety quick read' to our website <u>https://www.naburnschool.com/e-safety-parent-information/e-safety-guick-read-twitch</u>

For those that aren't aware, Twitch is a livestreaming service, with a focus on gaming. Users can publicly broadcast themselves playing and/or commenting on games for other people to watch. It has a minimum age of 13 to sign up specified in its terms and conditions - which is true of many/most social media platforms, of course, but there isn't any mechanism for age verification.

Primary-aged pupils *shouldn't* have Twitch accounts, but that doesn't mean that none of them do, or that they aren't watching on a family member's account. Watching other people playing computer games is an INCREDIBLY popular thing to do!

Sprucing up the playground area
