Sycamore Class Autumn Newsletter - September 2022











Welcome to a new year in Sycamore Class! We hope you all had a wonderful break and are raring to go again, as we all are! This term is already proving to be super busy but LOTS of fun!

English Year 3/4's first novel is 'Krindlekrax' by Philip Ridley and Year 5/6's is 'Who let the Gods out?' by Maz Evans – both original, exciting adventures which we will use to inspire our writing of diary entries, character and setting descriptions, recounts and narratives. All year groups will then be studying Greek myths to tie in with our topic (below).

Maths Y3-6 are concentrating on place value this half term, then the four operations and fractions. Times table fluency is *essential* in all year groups so please do encourage children to use TT Rockstars regularly at home.

Topic We are learning all about the **Ancient Greeks**: how their civilisation grew and changed over time and the influence they had on the wider world. This half term we will compare life in different time periods within Greek history before looking at Greek achievements and influence including the first Olympics, democracy, arts and culture, famous battles and mythology.

Science We will look at different properties of materials - conducting experiments and researching their properties. This half term we will focus on thermal conductors and insulators, measuring changes in temperature and testing solubility in different materials. Next half term we will explore mixtures, looking at sieving, filtering and evaporating, as well as learning about reversible and irreversible changes.

RE We are studying **festivals in different religions** and how they are celebrated - including Easter, Divali, Ramadan and Pesach. We will research what makes a religious festival special, how they are celebrated and what differences/similarities they share.

Other areas: PSHCE Our 'Being me in my world' topic focuses upon recognising our qualities, strengths, hopes and aims and taking responsibility for our actions. PE will be Multi skills and football, taught by Total Sports each Tuesday and Friday. Please ensure your child(ren) wear PE kit and trainers to school on both of those days and have long hair tied back. Spanish As Spain is such a popular holiday destination, we have decided to introduce this as our language this year. We will be learning greetings, numbers, colours, days of the week and months. We will also work on our Spanish accents and how to write words and phrases accurately. British Values Our focus will be democracy (in the context of Ancient Greece – and in action, during our House Captain elections!) Computing - internet safety, cyber-crime, how to use technology safely, respectfully and responsibly, as well as recognising acceptable/unacceptable behaviour online.
