The Open the Book Team started at the very beginning of the Bible with a Worship Time on The Creation. Thank you for presenting this fascinating story to us.










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Mr G away

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Link with a Sri-Lankan School

We are in the very early stages of developing a school twinning project with a school in Sri Lanka. The school is called Athena. It is a small private school in Kandy with only twenty pupils at present. It takes both girls and boys from Reception up to Year 3, although it will keep adding classes as the children move up each year. It is intended that the school will cater for secondary pupils in the future. So the children will stay in this school for all their school lives.

Children in Sri Lanka can attend school for free but those government schools have very big classes. They also learn by just sitting and listening to the teachers quietly in rows of desks, rather like in Victorian times in England! Athena School offers the children a more exciting way of learning, allowing the children to think outside the box, ask questions, research subjects for themselves and have dedicated teachers interested in what the children want to learn and who look for new ideas to stimulate the children's learning. Each class has its own teacher but they combine the classes for some lessons as each class has such a small number of children.

One of the most important aspects of Athena school is the teaching of good English. Speaking English well, is important because it opens up opportunities for work when the children are adults. When the British left Sri Lanka in the 1970's, the Sri Lankan government decided to stop teaching English in schools. They then found that not having the ability to speak English cut their people off from the rest of the world. Only the privileged children of very wealthy families could access English lessons as they were sent to other countries to learn English! The government reversed the decision and now English is considered to be essential, so our children could play a very important part in helping the children of Athena improve their English. It will also be of mutual benefit for us to acquire a wider world view, as we share cultural and geographical experiences. This will hopefully be a very exciting experience for everyone concerned!


