




Questionnaires

ESafety Section

This week's e-safety guide might be a useful reminder for us all - grown-ups, as well as the children! Simplicity can be a beautiful thing. When it comes to passwords, though ... well, not so much. The password '123456', for example, has featured in data breaches some 23 million times to date. What's more, around five million people still – incredibly – have their password set as just 'password'. On average, that takes a half-way competent hacker less than a second to crack!

Sports teams are also best avoided (more than 750,000 hacked UK passwords were some variation on the name of a Premier League football club), as is anything we might accidentally give clues to on social media: family members' names and birthdays, for instance.
