Sycamore Class Summer Newsletter – April 2023



Welcome to the Summer term! We hope you all had a restful Easter break with plenty of egg eating and relaxation! Please find below a taste of what KS2 will be enjoying this term.

English Year 3 / 4's first novel will be The Night Bus Hero by Onjali Q. Rauf. We will write a diary entry from the viewpoint of a character from our book and also study The Highwayman (poem) by Alfred Noyes and write our own version of it. **Year 5/6** will focus upon all aspects of grammar and reading comprehension in the next two weeks, prior to SATS, then be writing across a wide range of text types including persuasion, biography, narrative, instruction and explanation texts. We will hold another 'Golden Writing' session for parents/family members at some point this term and hope you can join us!

Maths Y34 will concentrate on decimals, mass and capacity, time, statistics, properties of shape and position and direction. **Y56** will study 'Reasoning' (across all Maths topics) plus angles, volume, translation, co-ordinates and, post-SATs, more detailed maths investigations. Times **table fluency** remains the bedrock of most areas of maths so please do encourage your child(ren) to use TT Rockstars regularly at home.

Topic - We will learn about the legacy of the Roman justice system and **crime and punishment through** the Anglo-Saxon, Tudor and Victorian periods. We will also study the famous highwayman, Dick Turpin. As part of this topic, we have planned an exciting trip to York Castle Museum (see dates list below). Science In Y34 we will learn about Forces and Magnets. We will look at contact and non-contact forces, including friction and magnetism. Y56 will study Forces and Mechanisms - learning about resistance, levers and pulleys as well as investigating friction and gears using their own bikes. RE Y34 will be looking at the question, "What does it mean to be a Christian in Britain today?" We will be discussing what Christians do at home, in church and in the wider community and why these things are important to them. Y56 will focus upon 'Green Religion' and consider the key question 'How and why should religious communities do more to care for the Earth? In PSHCE we will cover 'Healthy me' and 'Healthy friendships/relationships'. PE will be striking and fielding / Athletics (on Tuesdays, taught by Total Sports) and swimming (Fridays). Please ensure that your child(ren) wear PE kit (white top/red hoody/black or grey shorts/leggings and trainers) on Tuesdays/Fridays and bring swimwear and a towel on Fridays. Children with long hair must tie it back and, if possible, wear swimming hats please, but goggles are optional. In Spanish we will be learning about animals, Spanish traditions and celebrations, and numbers. In Computing we will be learning how to code using CodeStudio.
