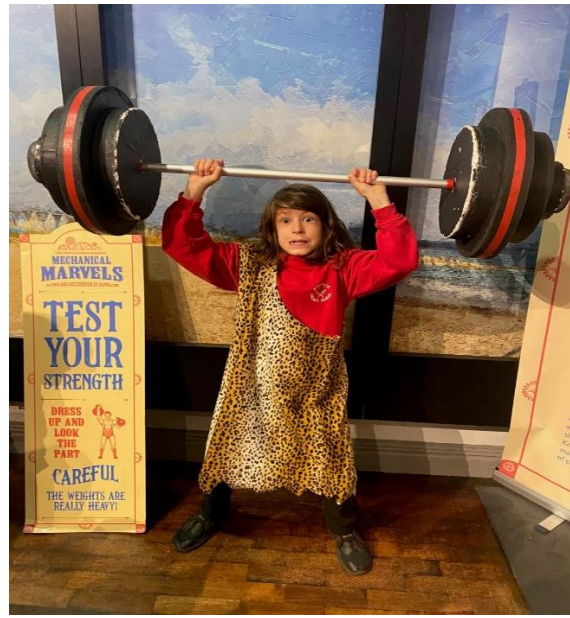

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making it all possible through a lot of work. Thank you also to the Office Staff for all they have done to help the arrangements and organisation.

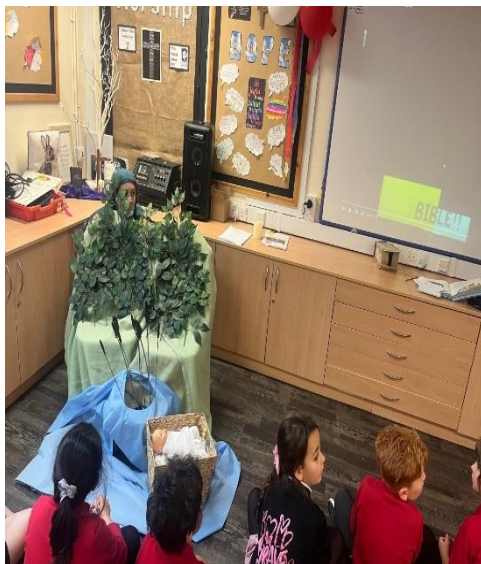
Cricket Match v AYJS

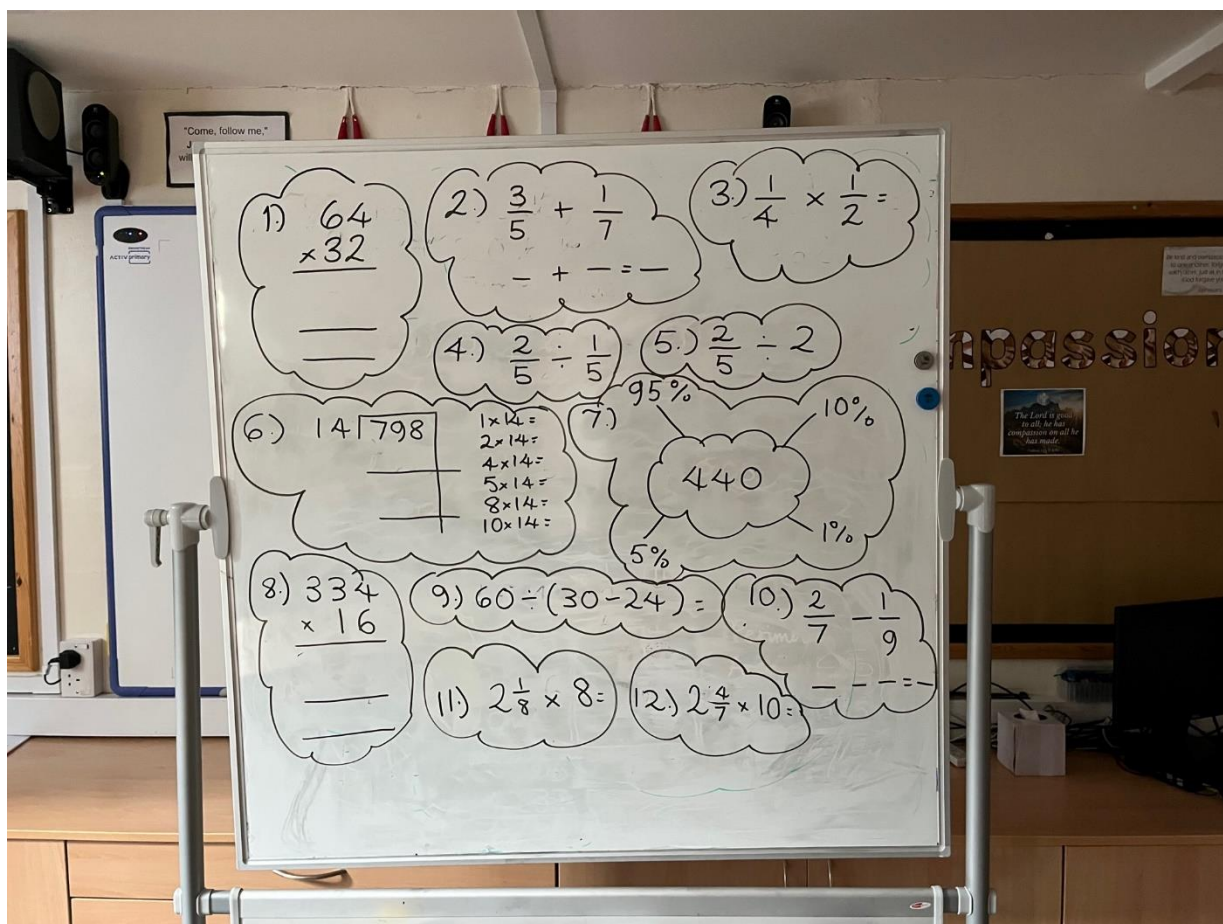
