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Clean Air Day - Let's take steps to protect our health from air pollution this #CleanAirDay on 15th June 2023.

Even though we can't see it, air pollution impacts our health whatever age we are. Children are especially vulnerable to the effects, with air pollution linked to low birth weights and poor lung development; it can even contribute to reduced intelligence and mental health issues.

Clean Air Day 2023 aims to highlight that improving air quality not only benefits our physical health and the environment but can also protect our mental and brain health.

The good news is there are simple steps we can all take to help us avoid toxic air and cut down on the pollution we cause. Any reductions in air pollution that we make will lead to health improvements for us and in our local community – we all have a part to play!

What can you do to improve air quality outside school

On Clean Air Day (Thursday 15th June), we would encourage you to walk, cycle or scoot to school if possible (or walk part of the journey from a nearby location). Walking is an easy and accessible way to improve physical and mental health and helps to improve local air quality.

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Blue Cross

Blue Cross are conducting a survey during June and July to measure the impact of their educational talks. Last week KS2 completed a questionnaire relating to their empathy towards pets and how they should be cared for. On 9th June, a Blue Cross representative will give a presentation entitled 'What pets need' and invite discussion on each of the following welfare needs:

Food and water; Environment; The ability to act naturally; Whether or not they can be kept alone or require company of their own kind; Protection.

KS2 will then be asked to repeat the initial questionnaire to see if their views have altered in any way. The results are anonymised and will be circulated to all participating schools later in the year.

He brought in all the equipment he needed on his seventy-three day adventure and even allowed the children to step inside his boat to have a look. 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
TTRockstars
