We had such a brilliant day at Temple Newsam on Thursday, learning about all things Tudor. We dressed up in stunning Tudor outfits and made a human timeline. After learning all about how to spot a Tudor portrait, Queen El(issy)beth I ordered her royal artists to create portraits of her. The artists are nervously awaiting her final judgement!

have written some incredible diary entries recently, in role as Thomas Falconer, the young child who is the main character in our Tudor novel. The children created such moving, historically accurate pieces of work and are rightly proud of them. An absolute highlight of this week was our trip to Temple Newsam, during which we were immersed in all things Tudor: from architecture to interior design; from costumes to portraits – their composition and styling and all of the clues that tell us the sitters were rich and respected. We then made a 'living portrait' of Queen Elizabeth; dressed in exquisite Tudor clothing; learned how to greet each other – and how to dance - as Lords and Ladies; made stunning collages of Tudor characters using velvet, silk, lace and doilies and also created a human timeline showing the chain of ownership of Temple Newsam from its creation, in 1500, to its transfer to Leeds City Council in 1922. There is so much more to see there (including Henry VIII's fabulous four poster bed) so it's definitely worth a trip if you are in the area!



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
