- **SYCAMORE – Please can you ensure consents are completed for Countyside Day**

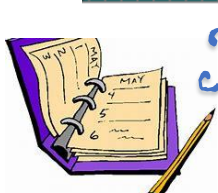

Year 1 have begun to develop their knowledge of multiplication this week. We can now recognise equal groups and have been adding equal groups by counting in 2s, 5s or 10s. On Tuesday, we went on a ladybird hunt to find equal groups and wrote addition sentences to add the groups together to find the total amount of spots on each ladybird. The children are becoming increasingly confident counting in 2s, 5s and 10s! Keep practising at home Year 1s!
