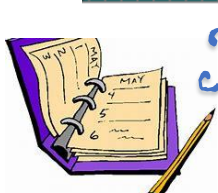
Reflection Corner

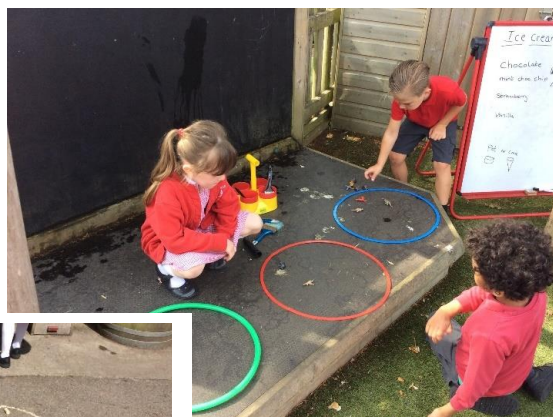

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This week, the Year 1s have been introduced to multiplication and division. We have had a go at sharing objects into equal groups and are becoming confident at recognising how many equal groups we have, how many objects in each group and how many objects we have shared to begin with.



Acorn Class



EYFS used tangram shapes to create their own shape pictures this week. They manipulated and rotated their shapes to create their design and then challenged their partner to have a go at recreating their picture. We read the story *Mouse Shapes* by Ellen Stoll and created shape pictures using paper shapes and described the position of each shape in relation to each other.

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This week Willow have started a new class book: Flotsam by David Wiesner. On Tuesday, we discovered a large pile of flotsam in our classroom. Amongst the items that had been washed up, we found a welly boot, a glass bottle, driftwood, a beach ball, a flip flop and a box camera. We then created biographies for these items to explain how they may have ended up as flotsam. One of these items may hold the secret to the rest of the book but we'll have to wait until next week to find out!
