We know you will agree that Mrs Davies embodies all of our school values.



On Thursday we had Diversity Day. We started by reading the book *All are Welcome* by Alexandra Penfold. We talked about the meaning of diversity and linked this with our core values of Aspiration, Respect and Community. We each spoke about what we aspired to be when we were older and how everybody has different hopes and dreams. We discussed how we can show respect to people that are different to ourselves and why it's important to work as a community and to help each other. We each made a handprint to go on our tree to show that we are different leaves on the same tree. When our Reception new starters joined us for a stay and play session in the afternoon, we made sure to welcome them all and show kindness and respect to each other.











This week Willow have been learning about symmetry and horizontal and vertical lines. On Wednesday we went to the Future Forest on a line hunt. We photographed all the horizontal and vertical lines that we spotted. Y2 looked for 2-D shapes and even found a hexagon in the forest!













On Thursday we held a diversity day. Nathalie Noret came in from the university and delivered an assembly and a workshop on the theme of Words Hurt. We thought about the lasting impact our words can have on each other and signed up to a pledge to do our best to use kind words. In the afternoon we wrote thoughts, prayers and poems based on the day's activities.



Our AMAZING Mrs Davies

In February 2026 a team of 6 ladies, including Equine Para-Adventures founder Steph who is disabled, will take on EPA's flagship expedition when they will travel to Argentina in a bid for Steph to become the world's first wheelchair-dependent person to ride by horseback across the Andes, finishing in Chile. They will be following the route taken by General José de San Martin and his army in 1817 to liberate Chile from the Spanish monarchy, riding mountains up to 4,400m in height and sleeping in tents for the duration of the expedition (7 days in the mountains). All kit and equipment needed for the expedition, including Steph's wheelchair, will be carried on mules whilst the team make this arduous journey.



Through this challenging expedition, the team seek to inspire others to go and have their own adventures and to show that the impossible can be possible. The team will demonstrate what determination, passion, courage and teamwork can achieve. The team want to raise disability awareness and get those often-difficult conversations started, whilst evidencing the difference between equality and equity.

Equine Para-Adventures aims to provide opportunities for disabled adults to be involved in equine activities outside of classic equestrian centres/riding school set ups. These will take the form of challenges, adventures and expeditions, equine therapy type activities in 'real life' settings, and 'taster' sessions for disabled adults interested in working in the equestrian industry.


