Attendance & Punctuality: Every Day and Every Minute Count

Good attendance and punctuality make a big difference to both **learning** and **confidence**. National data shows a clear link between strong attendance and positive outcomes.

Across England in 2024/25, the **attendance rate was 93.1%** (with 6.9% absence). We're heading in the right direction, but there's still more to do.

Why Being on Time Matters

Even small amounts of lateness quickly add up:

- 5 minutes late each day = over 3 days of learning lost in a year
- 15 minutes late each day = nearly 2 weeks of learning lost

How You Can Help

- Aim to arrive at 8:40am (the school gate opens at 8:40am), so your children can settle and start the day calmly.
- Book medical or other appointments outside school hours, where possible.
- If you're facing challenges with mornings, let us know early we're here to help with practical solutions.


