



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We just wanted to share a lovely moment: the class was captivated when a blue tit's nest and egg were brought in. It sparked so much curiosity and wonder - a special way to connect with nature and each other.



Acorn Class



Year 1 have been getting stuck into their learning about greater than, less than, and equals to using fun activities like dominoes to compare numbers and build their understanding. Year 2 had a problem to solve using the given numbers 12, 15, 16 and 19. They had to find as many different ways as possible of ordering them, for example: $19 > 15 > 12$. It was fantastic to see their reasoning skills in action!

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Y3/4 started their science topic, 'Rocks and Soils' this week. The children learnt that rocks can be sorted into three groups according to how they are formed: Sedimentary rocks, Metamorphic rocks and Igneous rocks. First, we explored the different processes of rock formation through creating edible rocks! Then, through careful observation of rock samples, we looked for clues to help us sort different rocks into one of the three groups.



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This week we began our topic of Earth and Space. We investigated why scientists started to believe that the Earth wasn't flat and replicated a shadow experiment that was used to prove that the Earth was spherical. We learnt about how long it takes each planet to orbit the sun and why this differs. We even put this into practice in the playground!
