

Although the snow didn't settle, they reached out to catch the falling flakes, watching them land on their coats and hands and taking a closer look at each one making the most of the wintry moment.

Children worked with number lines by placing given numbers in the correct positions and filling in missing values. We then introduced number lines with different start and end points, and for those ready for a challenge, we explored counting in 2s, 5s, and 10s building confidence with number patterns and place value.



This week, Willow have used the small world area to create an underwater Kingdom. Through close observation, this stimulated the children to extend their descriptive language and use of fronted adverbials. It was fantastic to see this impact on their own setting descriptions during independent writing of their 'Quest' stories. We are sad for this book study to come to an end as it has given us so

many rich learning activities!




















Sycamore have started our new science unit on electricity. The children have created series circuits which light up a bulb, make a buzzer buzz and power a motor. They then drew their circuits using the correct scientific symbols. They investigated how to make their bulbs brighter and how to light up multiple bulbs in their circuits. If the circuits didn't work, the children used their investigative skills to work out which component was faulty and replaced it.






