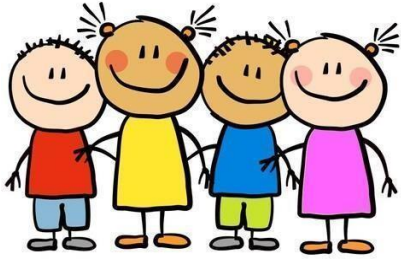

Home Learning Menu

We've put together a selection of fun, creative activities inspired by our theme:

Our Planet - The One Place we all call Home

These optional activities can be completed at your own pace throughout the half term.

Choose as many as you like - **the more creative, the better!**

<p>Animal Mask</p> <p>Make or decorate a mask of your favourite animal.</p> 	<p>Habitat Picture</p> <p>Draw or paint where your favourite animal lives (forest, ocean, desert). Add your animal into the picture e.g., cat, dog, pig, hen, fox, bat, bug, rat.</p> <p>Write the CVC word for your animal next to it.</p> <p>You could also add other CVC words that match things in the habitat e.g., sun, log, mud, net.</p>	<p>Be an explorer</p> <p>Dress up as an explorer like Columbus or Armstrong and act out a short adventure.</p> 
<p>Learn a counting song to sing to your friends.</p> <p>E.g., Five little explorers went out one day, across the world and far away. Columbus sailed and Armstrong flew, One little explorer came back too! Keep counting down (five, four, three, two, one). Children can act it out with hand movements (waves for sailing, arms for flying).</p>	<p>Reuse Craft</p> <p>Use old boxes, tubes, or packaging to make something new, a model, toy, or artwork.</p> 	<p>Planet Promise</p> <p>Make a big circle to represent Earth. Inside the circle, draw or write one promise about how you will look after our planet.</p> <p>Examples: <i>pick up litter, recycle, save water, be kind to animals.</i></p> <p>Decorate your Earth with blue and green colours, stickers, or collage materials to make it shine.</p>
<p>Special places</p> <p>Draw a picture of your favourite place on Earth and explain to an adult why this place is special to you. What makes a place special?</p> <p>Have a go at labelling your picture.</p> 	<p>Go on an 'awe and wonder' walk</p> <p>Go for a walk in nature and look carefully at what you can see around you. What wonders in nature can you find? Talk about how they make you feel.</p> <p>Take photos or draw what you find.</p> 	<p>Reading</p> <p>This is a required daily task and not part of the optional activities. Listen to your child read their book for approximately 10-15 minutes per day. Remember to give them lots of praise – celebrate their success! If they can't read a word, read it to them. After they have finished, talk about the book together.</p>  <p>Share a book together. Read it to or with them. Discuss the pictures, enjoy the story, predict what might happen next, use different voices for the characters, explore the facts in a non-fiction book.</p> <p>The main thing is that you have fun!</p>
