


# KS1 Spring 1

## Home Learning Menu


We've put together a selection of fun, creative activities inspired by our theme:

*Our Planet - The One Place we all call Home*

These optional projects can be completed at your own pace throughout the half term.

Choose as many as you like - **the more creative, the better!**

<p><b>Continents in Colour</b></p> <p>Create a large, colourful artwork showing the <b>seven continents</b>, but instead of just colouring them in, decorate each continent with patterns, animals, or symbols that represent it. E.g., Africa – zebra stripes or elephants.</p> 	<p><b>Explorers Diary</b></p> <p>Imagine you are Christopher Columbus or Neil Armstrong. Write a short diary entry (or draw comic-style pictures) describing what you saw, how you felt, and what made your journey exciting.</p> 	<p><b>Habitat Hunt</b></p> <p>Go outside (garden, park, or local area) and look for signs of different habitats. Draw or take notes about where you found birds, minibeasts or plants. Label your findings.</p> 
<p><b>Poem or Song</b></p> <p>Write a short poem or song about Our Planet – The One Place We All Call Home.</p> 	<p><b>Planet Protectors Pledge</b></p> <p>Write a short pledge about how you can look after our planet e.g., recycling, saving water, turning off lights. Decorate it with drawings.</p> 	<p><b>Thankfulness Tree</b></p> <p>Draw a tree and write something you are thankful for on each leaf.</p> 
<p><b>My favourite place on Earth</b></p> <p>Draw a picture of your favourite place on Earth and complete the sentence 'My favourite place on Earth is...' and explain why.</p> 	<p><b>Create Earth</b></p> <p>Create a model Earth using junk materials. Use collage materials or paints to add colour to your Earth.</p> 	<p><b>Reading</b></p> <p><b>This is a required daily task and not part of the optional activities.</b> Listen to your child read their book for approximately 10-15 minutes per day. Remember to give them lots of praise – celebrate their success! If they can't read a word, read it to them. After they have finished, talk about the book together.</p>  <p>Share a book together. Read it to or with them. Discuss the pictures, enjoy the story, predict what might happen next, use different voices for the characters, explore the facts in a non-fiction book.</p> <p><b>The main thing is that you have fun!</b></p>
