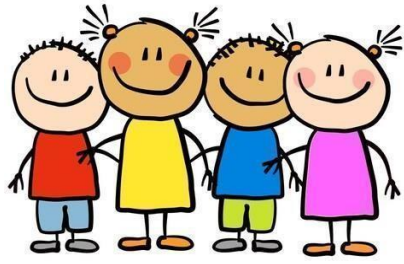

<p>Storytime</p> <p>Read a nature-themed book at home e.g., about plants, gardens, or bugs.</p> <p>Draw your favourite part.</p> 	<p>Number Formation</p> <p>Practice forming all your numbers correctly. <p>Grow something at Home</p> <p>Plant a seed (cress, beans, sunflower) and watch it grow.</p> <p>Can you draw or photograph the stages of plant growth each week?</p> 	<p>Mud Kitchen Creations</p> <p>Make "mud pies" or "nature soup" using soil, water, and natural materials.</p> <p>Children name their creation and explain what's in it.</p> 	<p>Muddy Boots Walk</p> <p>After a walk, draw a simple map showing where you went.</p> <p>Add symbols for trees, puddles, flowers etc.</p> 
<p>Leaf and Petal Art</p> <p>Make a picture using fallen leaves or petals you find on the ground, please don't pick them from living plants.</p> 	<p>The Growing Song</p> <p>Learn the song to the tune of: (Row, Row, Row Your Boat)</p> <p>Grow, grow, grow the seed, Push it in the ground. Roots go down and shoots come up, Plants grow all around.</p> <p>Or try making up your own plant-growing song with your family.</p>	<p>Reading</p> <p>This is a required daily task and not part of the optional activities. Listen to your child read their phonics book for approximately 10 minutes a day. Remember to give them lots of praise! If they can't read a word, encourage them to sound it out or read it to them. After, discuss the book.</p>  <p>Share a book for pleasure together. Read it to or with them. Discuss the pictures, enjoy the story, predict what might happen next, use different voices for the characters, explore the facts in a non-fiction book.</p>
